

Each of the Cruisers featured here is carefully outfitted with standard equipment that often appears as "optional" or "not available" with other boats in this size range.

For example, we use Barient winches because we think they're one of the best brands available. They're standard at no extra cost.

Every O'Day Cruiser comes with a stainless steel bow pulpit. An aluminum outboard bracket is shipped standard with every boat. There are teak handrails on all O'Day Cruisers. Decks are gel-coated in a two tone pattern with anti-skid molded into the surface. Standing rigging is stainless steel while sheets and halyards are braided Dacron. And the head is a self-contained one-piece unit. Sails come with each boat. They're custom-cut Dacron made to our specifi-

cations. O'Day delivers a Cruiser that is complete except for your safety gear and personal items for galley and crew.

Also check the list of standard equipment at the back of this brochure. When you buy an O'Day Cruiser, you don't have to spend a fortune – or waste sailing time – having your boat outfitted. You're buying a sailboat that's ready to *sail*!

O'DAY 22

PERFECT FOR AN AFTER-NOON. COMFORTABLE FOR AN OVERNIGHT.



The O'Day 22 is one of the most versatile cruisers ever designed.

If you only have a few hours, you can sail away from the slip within minutes of coming aboard. If you have time to spare, gather your crew, fill the roomy lockers with provisions, and head out for a weekend or a week. The 22 sleeps four comfortably.

The keel/centerboard design makes this an easy boat to trailer, a trustworthy deepwater cruiser, and a perfect exploring boat, with shoal draft of just 1'3," board-up.

As pretty to sail as she is to look at.

The O'Day 22's graceful lines, accented by teak handrails and toe rail caps, two-tone beige and cream decks and handsome hull striping prove that a good looking boat needn't cost a fortune.

And she feels as good under sail. For the novice: forgiving, uncomplicated and encouraging. For the veteran: rewarding, responsive and precise. Any way you look at her, the 22 is a good looking boat.

In the cockpit, there's room for family and friends to stretch out.

And in the cabin? The galley includes a built-in stainless steel sink, a 15 gallon water supply and room for an optional two burner stove.

When it's time to turn in, stow the dining table and stretch out on the 6'6" settee berths. Crew or guests will be forward in a separate cabin on comfortable "V" berths. Sliding curtains don't pro-

vide the privacy of a door, so the O'Day 22 has a teak door between cabins.

Their "extras" are our "standard equipment."

That's especially important to the novice, or the first-time sailboat owner. Because you won't have to spend time researching and searching for the right equipment.

The O'Day 22 is practically ready to sail the minute you buy her. In addition to those standard features we mentioned earlier in this brochure – the Barient winches, sails, outboard bracket, bow pulpit and self-contained head, and others – there's even more. The 22 is complete with roller reefing, a mast tabernacle that makes raising and lowering the spar much

easier, and Dacron running rigging. All you need to add is ground tackle, safety gear and outboard motor if you want power.





O'DAY 23

THE FAMILY-SIZE CRUISER THAT LOOKS—AND PER-FORMS—LIKE A RACER.



Only O'Day could create a trailerable 23 that offers so much and sacrifices so little.

As a cruiser, she has plenty of room and comfort for family and friends.

And as a performance boat? You'll understand the first time you turn her loose in a good breeze.

The performance you want...

If you're new to sailing, you'll be delighted by the 23's simplicity

and cooperative nature. You'll also be surprised at how easy it is to sail this boat *well* with a little practice.

If you're an old hand, you'll be excited at how quickly the 23 will take you where you want to go, precisely and responsively, in deep water – board-down, or a shoal cove – board-up.

...and the room you need.

The O'Day 23 boasts outstandingly efficient use of cabin space.



For the cook, there's an ingenious one-piece galley – complete with fresh water and sink – that slides out from under the deck aft of the starboard settee. The whole unit runs on tracks, and locks into position. It includes space for your stove, a cutting surface, storage space for pots and a pan, and even the sink drains overboard.


Slide the galley away, fold the table against the bulkhead, and you have two 6'7" settee berths. Extended, the port settee is also a roomy double bed.

Forward and through the doorway, there's a private head to port, hanging locker to starboard, plenty of storage bins everywhere, and a 6'3" V-berth that sleeps two.











O'DAY 25

THE TRAILERABLE LONG-RANGE CRUISER.



Few boats suited to ocean cruising are equally suited trailering behind your car.

The O'Day 25 is designed for both. So if vacations mean long land trips to do some long distance ocean or lake cruising, this 25 is for you.

A mid-size cruiser with big boat roominess, stability and performance, the O'Day 25 is the ideal boat for the serious sailing family. **Spacious enough for six.**

Most trailerable cruisers are simply too small for long trips. The result: "cabin fever."

The O'Day 25 solves the problem. With a cockpit that's 7 feet across. And with 100% useable interior space. There's five and a half feet of headroom in the main cabin. And you'll have full headroom when seated at the dining table. Placement of the seat backs is designed to offer more sitting room – and makes a wider berth. There's additional storage space behind the seat cushions, too.

The port berth expands into a comfortable double while the star-board and quarter berth are goodsize singles.



The forward V-berth is separated from the salon by a fully enclosed head and built-in vanity, hanging locker, sink and water pump.

Look at the galley area: ice box, stainless steel sink, dish storage area, stove locker, condiment rack and food and utensil lockers are right at the companionway where there is plenty of light and air.


Available in keel and centerboard versions.

Unlike the other O'Day Cruisers, the 25 is available in two configurations. You can have a shoal-draft centerboarder that draws just 2'6" board-up, and a full 6' board-down. Or, if you sail in deep water all of the time and have high performance on your mind, you'll probably want the fin keel model that draws 4'6" and has a larger rig with 290 sq. ft. of sail area. But even with 1775 lbs. of lead ballast, it can still be moved from port to port aboard a trailer.


Both handle precisely and responsively thanks to a well-

balanced rudder. Both will get you from here to there in record time when speed is of the essence.

STANDARD EQUIPMENT: IT'S WHERE O'DAY SETS THE STANDARD.

Each of the O'Day Cruisers is a fullyequipped pocket yacht featuring many construction details and standard equipment items that make it a uniquely complete sailaway boat and a fine investment.

The photograph featured here is the O'Day 22. It was selected to demonstrate just how complete every O'Day Cruiser is when it leaves the factory.



Bow Pulpit – A welded stainless steel pulpit gives extra support when working with the jib, anchor, or docklines. Lifelines are standard on the O'Day 23 and 25.

Sails – A working jib and mainsail are shipped with every O'Day Cruiser. They come from Neil Pryde – one of the largest and best sailmakers in the world. (We race and win with Pryde Sails.)

Mast and Boom – Aluminum is the industry standard. We coat our spars to keep them looking good, and to keep corrosion and oxidation away from every O'Day.




Forward Hatch – Mounting the hatch flush means easier tacking with fewer hang-ups for the jib, longer life for sails and a comfortable place to sit up forward. It also means less chance for leaks.





Teak Handrails – They look good, they're firm in your grip, and they're genuine teak so they require little maintenance. If you look along the edge of the deck, you'll see a teak toerail, too. It's standard on every O'Day Cruiser.






Hardware – When we outfit an O'Day we go for the good stuff: Barient winches, Schaefer and Merriman hardware that's either stainless or durably coated to give it long life in the rugged marine environment.



Running Rigging – All sheets and halyards are low-stretch braided Dacron[®] line. It's quality line that's made to give years and years of service.

Outboard Bracket – Will you be using an outboard motor? The bracket you'll need to mount it is a standard feature on all O'Day Cruisers. It's coated aluminum, made to last.
